Pixel 2 force restart

If you're having trouble with your Google Pixel 2 smartphone and need to reset it, here's how it's done. A jump to soft ResetJump to the Hard ResetJump Menu to Bootup Hard ResetSoft ResetA soft reset will free the device from being frozen. These steps will not delete data from the Press device and hold the Power and Volume Down buttons for about 15 seconds until the screen changes. You should be able to power the device again. The reset the factory's hard reset will set the Pixel back to factory settings and default data. All data on the device will be erased. Option 1 - PhoneStarting Menu from the Home screen, swipe the app drawer and select Settings > Backup &; reset > Reset factory data > PHONE RESET. Option 2 - Pixel Hardware Button by pressing and holding the Power button, then tapping Power off. With the device turned off, press and hold the Power and Volume Down buttons simultaneously. The Android logo should appear indicating the device is in bootloader mode. Use the volume buttons to toggle the option to Recovery Mode. Press and hold The Power to make the Recovery Mode selection. Press Power and Volume Up. Release Volume Up after 3 seconds, but continue to hold Power. Still keep holding Power until you see a screen with Android that says No commands. Once you see this screen, you can release Power. Use the volume buttons to toggle the option to Delete factory data/reset. Select Yes. The device must complete the hard reset. Select Reboot once complete. These instructions apply to both the Pixel 1 and the original XL versions of the Google Pixel. There are times when your phone freezes for a few seconds and returns to normal operations. Such issues and issues may be normal on some phones especially if you use intensive apps or games. There is a freezing issue where it leaves your phone unresponsive and that seems to be the case with some of our readers who own a 2-unit Google Pixel that reports their device no longer responds no matter what they do. Some are stuck on specific screens or apps they use when phones stop responding while others only look black on the display. How to make your Google Pixel 2 that doesn't respond anymore meanwhile this issue might give you an impression that there are serious problems with hardware because your phone no longer responds no matter what you do, in reality, it's a pretty small issue. That is, if there are no clear signs of hardware and/or liquid damage because if it happens that your phone gets fallen on the hard surface before the problem, then solving the problem itself will be useless. So, assert the problem starts for no apparent reason, here's what you need to do to fix it: The first solution: Forced restart or soft resetJiji is familiar with the battery pull method we're doing to the phone with removable batteries, well this is the equivalent of that. Of course you can push it immediately if your phone is frozen on a screen that still shows a picture. For example, if you send a message when the phone crashes and the screen is frozen on the screen that shows your text. But then again, if that happens then the first solution should have fixed the problem. So, if your device gets stuck on a black screen and won't respond, then it's possible that the battery gets drained plus the fact that the system may have crashed shortly before the battery runs empty.
